#### 2004/05 to the first guarter of 2009/10

In June 2009 more than a million documents and receipts were published online. These related to MPs' claims dating back to 2004/05 and up to 2007/08. In December 2009 these pages were updated to include information about MPs' claims made for costs incurred when staying away from their main home in 2008/09 and the first quarter of 2009/10. Further updates are now available via a searchable database.

  - Most suited to simple, static websites

- Strengths
  - Cost effective and simple to manage
  - Fastest method for large-scale collecting
  - Best method for third-party content
  - Improved, mature tools available
- Limitations
  - Can't capture everything, e.g. all dynamic content
  - May not be exhaustive
  - Requires careful configuration
  - Quality control



# **Database archiving**

- Benefits
  - Allows dynamic content to be archived
- Disadvantages
  - Does not preserve original interface
  - Immature, with limited DB support
  - Requires admin access

# **Database archiving**



## **Transactional archiving**

- Benefits
  - Records what users actually saw
- Disadvantages
  - Does not collect content which has not been viewed
  - Comparatively immature tools
